




Figure 1: Methods Used in Inventory Management

2. VISION BASED CHALLENGES AND FEATURES

The objective of this project is to apply the detection and classification of objects with the recognition of barcodes, QR codes, optical characters (OCR) and the detection of packages and pallets inside warehouses. We will create new deep learning models implemented on custom developed hardware that will be compatible with the industry domain.



During our research on the state of art for pallets detection in logistics we found public dataset and tried to replicate the work. We successfully replicated the work and we contributed to get better results in accuracy using YoloV4 model.

YoloV4-Tiny (mAP@0.50)	22.1%	49.98%	60.60%*

For YoloV4/YoloV4-tiny, we got this Results after taking more than 40 training sessions.




Figure 4: Palette tag need to recognize its barcode


Figure 5: Liquid leakage that must be recognized using AI

We tried to integrate the yolov4 model in our SBC. We tested it to predict objects in video sequence, and we reached from 9FPS to 21FPS by tweaking hyperparameters of YoloV4 models.

Challenge:

More FPS = Less Accuracy <u>Goal:</u> Get best FPS for highest accuracy score.

Challenge

Install SBC with camera and try to capture videos with best stabilization

Challenges:

1- Choosing the best camera model that can be stable enough to capture pallet tags with high resolution in a drone for industry.

2- Detecting all the content of the pallet 2 meters long from a close distance.(Camera FoV challenge, Camera Stabilization Challenge, Lighting Challenges).

Pros of the next generation solution:

- Better in health care for warehouse agents (more radiation of RFID means more cancer risks)
- Better way of using semiconductor to produce more sustainable devices instead of RFID tags

5. CONCLUSIONS


Now we still working on development and optimization of our prototype.
